Cancellation Policies

If you are registered but unable to attend, please inform Antonia Kreitner no later than June 22, 2025. Cancellations made up to eight days before the conference are free of charge. If you cancel between seven and five days prior to the event, 50 percent of the conference fee will be charged. This fee increases to 75 percent for cancellations made between four and three days before the conference. Cancellations or no-shows on the last two days before the event will be subject to the full conference fee.

Road Construction Measures

The main street in Tutzing is currently undergoing construction, which may lead to delays in arrival and departure. Bus and taxi services between the Academy and the train station may also be affected. Please take this into consideration when planning your journey.



Tutzing is situated approximately 35 km southwest of Munich on the shores of Lake Starnberg (Starnberger See). From Munich Central Station (Hauptbahnhof): Take the S-Bahn line S-6 or a regional train (RB) to Tutzing. Upon arrival at Tutzing station, take Bus 958/978 to "Klenzestrasse." Taxis are also available at the station's main entrance. Please check our website under "[How to Find Us](#)" for special conference ticket offers via Deutsche Bahn (DB).



From the airport: Take the S-Bahn line S-1 or S-8 to Munich Central Station, then follow the instructions above.



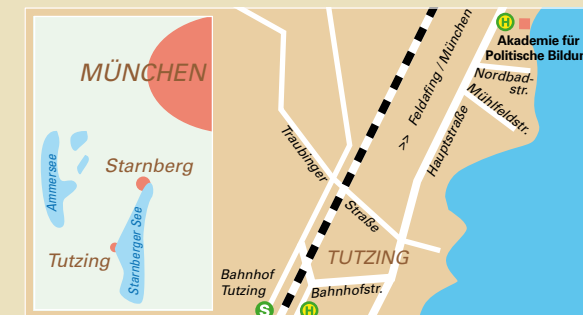
The Academy is also accessible on foot from Tutzing train station, with a walking time of approximately 20 to 30 minutes.



For those arriving by car, take freeway A95 from Munich via A952 to Starnberg, then continue on the federal highway. After passing through the town of Traubing, turn left. At the end of the road, turn right toward Tutzing. The Academy will be on your left shortly after you pass the town sign for Tutzing.
